Dear Senator Schumer,

The future of New York City hinges on sufficient support from the federal government. The COVID-19 pandemic and resulting deep economic downturn are wreaking havoc on the city's budget and the health and economic well-being of millions of its people.

New York City Federal Budget and Tax Response Team — who represent the majority of the city's major 250 human service nonprofit providers and together serve more than three million residents each year fighting poverty, supporting the vulnerable, and caring for people of all ages — call upon you to stand firm for a comprehensive stimulus package.

Additionally, FPWA's membership of more than 160 faith and community-based organizations – who reach more than 1.5 million people in New York's communities each year – have signed on to this letter.

Collectively and individual, our coalition has <u>written</u> and spoken with you and all New York City members of Congress about the need for the next relief package to be robust enough to meet the needs of the moment *and* build a foundation for a just recovery. We have submitted <u>more than thirty policy recommendations</u> to support human services nonprofits, the people they assist, and their workforces. Forthcoming stimulus legislation must continue such provisions as: state and local aid; the \$600 Pandemic Unemployment Compensation; expansion of SNAP and FMAP; enhancement of charitable giving; and supports to nonprofits organizations.

We are deeply grateful for your leadership in recognizing that many of these provisions must be built upon too, such as by tying unemployment benefits to economic conditions based on the health of the economy in a particular state as proposed in you and your colleagues' <a href="Morkforce Rescue Act">American</a> <a href="Workforce Rescue Act">Workforce Rescue Act</a> and investing in communities of color as proposed in you and your colleagues' <a href="Economic Justice Act">Economic Justice Act</a>.

Appreciating your critical role in negotiating a deal between the House-passed HEROES Act and the GOP proposals, and our eagerness to support your efforts, we respectfully offer the following questions to help our and our partners' local and national advocacy strategies.

- Will you commit to not agree to ANY short term or piecemeal package? This package needs to be large and comprehensive.
- There are parts of the package that seem to be falling away such as SNAP benefit increases, Puerto Rico, Rental Assistance, FMAP increases, and refundable tax credits (EITC and CTC) others. Can you help ensure these priorities stay in any package that does move forward?
- Is getting mixed immigrant status households access to cash assistance payments a priority?
- On key provisions, such as UI, housing, food assistance, and state aid, which members of the GOP are you negotiating with?
